

Better Nutrition, Better Tomorrow






- Last year, Bread focused its Offering of Letters on global nutrition so mothers and children could get the foods they need to lead healthy and fulfilling lives.
- This year, in addition to continuing our advocacy around global nutrition, we also turn our attention to children experiencing hunger in the U.S.

Malnutrition remains a leading cause of child deaths globally

- Global hunger and poverty rates have been cut nearly in half during the past 30 years.
- Still, more than 1 in 5 children under age five are not growing as they should.
- And millions are dangerously thin.





1 in 7 U.S. children live in food-insecure homes

- Children who suffer food insecurity have more headaches, colds and other illnesses than children who never went hungry....more susceptible to disease and infection!
- Summer is the hungriest time of the year.
 Fewer than 1 in 5 U.S. children who receive school meals benefit from summer nutrition programs, leaving millions without adequate nutrition
- IN ranks close to last (41st) in the number of eligible kids who access summer meal programs (FRAC report)





Our Goals:

Increase funding and flexibility for nutrition programs in the U.S., including: Summer EBT/S1918

Support legislation that strengthens U.S. leadership and increases funding for global nutrition.





S1918 Hunger Free Summer for Kids Act

- Bipartisan bill seeks to expand and strengthen effective Summer EBT pilot projects (Boozman and Leahy)
- Traditional summer meal programs only reach about 16% of kids nationally
- Summer EBT is
 - flexible and helps fill the gaps
 - needs to be scaled up

What's Different This Time?

- Most letters will be written at home
- Emails or phone calls offered as alternative
- OL Coordinators need to recruit members of their congregations/organizations to participate
- Working on a later time frame
- We will deliver summary (not letters) in local congressional office visits



What's the timeline?

March/April: Equip ourselves for at-home OL

May/June: Individuals send letters, emails, calls from home (no collection of letters)

June: OL Organizer reports counts to Charlie

July: In-person visits to legislators (if possible)



OL Organizers will...

Recruit others in your church to do the OL

personal contacts • church directory • church media

Ask what action(s) they took & with whom

letter • email • phone call • social media
